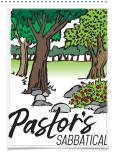
Reconciling Ministries Meeting - Sunday, July 1

Pancake Breakfast Fundraiser for the Zwingman Family: July 15

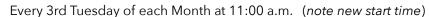

Rise Against Hunger is an international hunger relief organization that distributes food and life-changing aid in over 74 countries. This event is a kick-off event for Rise Against Hunger's south Silicon Valley location and is designated for JYM and Boy Scouts only. All are welcome to come and watch, but this is a shorter than usual event which will have news media & others from RAH present. We hope and expect to have our own church-wide foodpacking event in the future.

About Rise Against Hunger:

In 1998, envisioning a world without hunger, Rev. Ray Buchanan – a United Methodist minister – founded Stop Hunger Now. In 2017, Stop Hunger Now rebranded to become Rise Against Hunger. After enlisting as a U.S. Marine during the Vietnam War, Ray Buchanan quickly recognized that accomplishing a mission required "commitment to something larger than yourself." Driving Rise Against Hunger's work is the recognition that ending hunger is more than just feeding people, which led Rise Against Hunger to focus its feeding programs in areas where they can have a real impact

and expand their hunger-fighting programs beyond meal packaging and distribution. Rise Against Hunger meal packaging volunteers produce millions of nutritious meals annually that are then distributed to partners in countries around the world.

Another core focus of Rise Against Hunger is responding to crises-both natural and man-made. From droughts to floods, in conflict zones and transitioning political situations, food is often the most immediate need. When everyday access to food, wages, and market systems are destroyed in the wake of emergencies, Rise Against Hunger works through a network of in-country partners to address these needs.

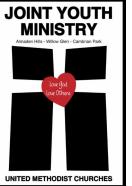
We kick off the **Welcome to JYM** with an ice cream social on **August 19** at Willow Glen UMC (time pending).

Tom's Rent Fund

Imagine what the world feels like living in San Jose on \$900 a month looking up from a wheel chair. Suppose you actually figured out how to survive on rent of \$700, leaving \$200 for food and essentials - not even \$7 a day. Our friend Tom, David Forderer's brother who attends WGUMC with David when he can doesn't have to imagine any of that - he lives it every minute of every day. I learned that Tom's landlord recently raised the rent, as he does every year. Now Tom's share of the rent is \$900 a month, his entire income. I met with Tom and his social case workers to lend support and learn more about the circumstances. The sudden change in Tom's rent situation has put the case workers into motion to try and find him another living situation - good news. But that may take some time. I would like to start a small fund to help Tom close the gap on his \$200 a month rent increase to buy him some time to land another living situation. My goal is to raise \$1,200 that would cover him for six months. Just knowing we are trying to help gives Tom a little peace of mind. If you try for just a moment to sit in his chair and see the world as Tom does, how can we not help him? Please give what you can to the WGUMC We Care fund designated to "Tom's Rent Fund." Thank you!
